




The Sun Sign Symbol of resurrection: Firesteel – C



Ancient firesteels - C

Fire steels are the traditional method for starting a fire. By striking a spark between flint and steel a hot spark is created. When using flint and steel to start a fire, the sharp edge of the flint shaves off a thin piece of the steel, the friction generates heat that ignites the spark.
