

## More Stolen from the East

The letter Shin was also stolen from the East.

This letter has two ways of being spelled in Kabbalah - one is Sin, which is the name of the Pagan Moon God, Sin. The other is Shin, which is the Sanskrit letter for "Fire". Note that the symbol of this letter in Hebrew is that of the trident, which is placed in the head in Kabbalah. This is because Sin, the Moon God, rules the Moon chakra, which is the sixth chakra, located in the head. This is also the Trident of Shiva and the head of this Trident in Hinduism is the symbol of the Two Serpents coming together at the Third eye.

Many of the images of the ancient wand of Hermes showed two Greek "S" letters coming together at the center of the head, atop the wand, meeting at the Moon chakra. In Sanskrit, the letter N is placed at the end of the letters. The letter Shi is Shin.

The name "Hindu" is originally from "Sindu" which means "Sage" in ancient Sanskrit and was also the name of a major river in India. It was named after Sin because the name Sin is the root title of the God Shiva and as such is a name of Shiva. [1] The God Shiva is the moon God in Hinduism, but also is the God of fire, which is spelled Shin. This letter in Kabbalah was stolen from the ancient name of Shiva.
